PTO BOARD Oting TUESDAY, APRIL 25TH AT 6PM IN THE LIBRARY

A. PRESIDENT

- Preside over and administrate all executive, officer, regular, and special committee meetings.
- Call special meetings of the PTO when required.
- Serve as an ex-officio member of the School Council and is the spokesperson for the PTO at the School Council meetings.
- Have a co-signature authority for payment of the PTO's financial obligations.
- Serve as an ex-officio member of all PTO committees.

B. VICE-PRESIDENT

- Assume the duties of the President in his/her absence.
- Perform additional duties as designated by the President.
- Assist in the formation of all committees and serve as an ex-officio member.
- Assure that committees meet their goals and report the results and recommendations to the organization.

C. SECRETARY

- Record and make available to the members copies of the minutes of all executive committee, regular, and special meetings.
- Conduct the correspondence of the PTO.
- Maintain a current file of reports, records, and correspondence of the PTO.
- Be responsible for recording and correcting any amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the PTO.
- Assist in typing, publishing, and distributing PTO reports and communications and assist other committees
 in communicating events to the school, or to the community as the need arises.
- Performs additional duties as designated by the President.

D. TREASURER

- Collect and deposit all duties and monies received through fundraising and contribution.
- Serve as an ex-officio member of the Fundraising Committee to aid in preparation for the fundraising reports.
- Maintain all records of receipts and expenditures for the PTO. A monthly accounting of all deposits, expenditures, and current account balances of all PTO controlled accounts shall be presented at every PTO membership meeting.
- Review and recommend payments of obligations to the President.
- Have co-signature authority for payment of the PTO's financial obligations.
- Within thirty days following the April meeting, the past (former) Treasurer shall balance all the financial records, including but not limited to the bank statements and all other accountings of the PTO, and shall physically transfer possession of said financial records to the newly elected Treasurer.
- Perform additional duties as designated by the President.

E. POLICIES AND PROCEDURES OFFICER

- Review and comment on policy changes proposed by the School Council or PTO membership.
- Identify policy that should be reviewed by the School Council.
- Serve as liaison to the School Council's Policy and Procedure Committee when necessary.
